

MESSAGE TO HEADS OF SCHOOLS

Osu! Hanshi, Shihan, Sensei, Senpai,

It will be our pleasure to welcome you free of charge at the Dagéki 2020. We invite you to **register your school as soon as February 1**st, **2020** to entitle your students to register as competitors.

Coaches

- Every coach accompanying your students will be invited to pay the spectator entry fee to access the premises (gymnasium).
- Every coach according to a ratio of 1 coach for 10 enrolled participants will receive an ID badge allowing him (in addition to his spectator bracelet) to enter the competition area.
- Coaches and competitors will have to remain outside the competition area when not in action.

Payment of competition fees for all your competitors

 As the head of your school, you will have to pay the competition fees for all your students previously registered in Kata and Fighting with protection (semiknockdown) in cash (\$CAD) at the "Sensei Table" in the Casgrain Sport Center, on May 30, from 7h30 to 9h00.

Competition rules

 Please make sure that you, your coaches and competitors are acquainted with the rules in effect at the Dagéki Championship 2020 and that you are willing to comply with these rules.

Meetings - Saturday, May 30

• A meeting with all heads of schools will be held in the gymnasium around <u>9h15</u>, before the Kata competition and around <u>13h15</u>, before the Fighting Competition.

Divisions and sub-divisions – Saturday, May 30

- Enrolled participants are grouped into pre-established divisions according to the type of event (Kata and Fighting with protection), their age, belt level, gender and weight (for fighting).
- A minimum of two participants per division is required; if only one candidate is enrolled, he will be notified and reclassified, if possible. If too many participants are enrolled into the same division, the division will be divided into two or more subdivisions.

- Each competitor registered online will receive an ID number as well as the number of the division (or sub-division) for each event in which he will participate.
- During the competition, divisions (and sub-divisions) will be called in increasing numerical order (1, 2, 3, 4-1, 4-2, 5, 6, etc.). Each division (sub-division) being called will be paired with a letter (A, B, C, D, E, F) identifying one of the 6 courts where the event will take place. The number of the division (sub-division) will also be displayed in front of the corresponding court.

Trophies and Podium - Saturday, May 30

• Trophies presentation for each division (sub-division) will take place on the court as soon as the competition will end. The winners will then go to the podium for a photograph.

Saturday, May 30:

- Kata 4 years old and up 10th Kyu to Black Belt
- Contact Karate Fighting with protection gear (Semi-knockdown) 4 years old and up – 10th Kyu to Black Belt

Sunday, May 31 - Elite Championship:

- Elite Kata 16 years old and up 1st Kyu to Black Belt
- Elite Contact Karate Fighting (Knockdown) 18 years old and up 4th Kyu to Black Belt

NB: Please note that a competitor cannot be registered in both Kata and Elite Kata nor in both Fighting and Elite Fighting.

ONLINE REGISTRATION STARTING ON FEBRUARY 1, 2020

Heads of schools must register their schools <u>before</u> their students can register as competitors. Only online registered schools and competitors will be accepted.

A maximum of 450 competitors will take part in the events of May 30.

All competitors registered in **Elite Fighting (Knockdown)** must also fill out and submit the online **Medical Form** to ensure their participation.

COMPETITION RULES

EVALUATION IN KATA AND ELITE KATA

- 1. A competitor cannot be enrolled in both Kata and Elite Kata.
- 2. All participants must perform a **traditional kata**. A traditional kata is a sequence of traditional karate techniques that is learned and performed by all members of an organization; it is a required element at belt promotion tests and not a "custom made" kata for one or few members of the organization.
- 3. Each participant introduces himself to the judges and announces the kata he will perform. Note that it is not required to identify the selected kata before that moment.
- 4. Each participant is given a mark between 5 and 10 by each judge; the total of the allocated marks is used to rank the participant within the division (or round).
- 5. Should a participant choose to perform a "nontraditional" kata, he would be disqualified, receiving the **minimum mark of 5** from each judge.
- 6. Since **traditional kata** forms vary from style to style, each participant is judged according to the following criteria:
 - Flagrant mistake, loss of balance, hesitation
 - Basic stances
 - Kicking techniques
 - Punching, blocking, shuto techniques
 - Consistency in the execution of techniques
 - Balance and fluidity
 - Spirit and intensity
 - Speed and control
 - Level of difficulty of kata

RULES - KATA - MAY 30

- The Kata competition is open to participants aged 4 years old and up and ranked from 10th kyu to Black Belt.
- 2. A judging team consists of **3 to 5 judges**, including the **head judge** who takes charge of the competition at the court.
- 3. The performance of each participant is evaluated with respect to that of the others within the division.
- 4. To help judges establish an **evaluation basis**, the 3 first participants of a division perform their kata in turn, without being given marks. Each one then comes back before the judges to receive his marks. The remaining participants perform their kata and get their marks right after their performance.

- 5. In the eventuality of a draw for the 1st, 2nd or 3rd place within a division, the head judge asks the tied competitors to perform a kata again to establish the winner for the position.
- 6. Participants ranked 4th kyu to Black Belt must prepare to perform two distinct traditional kata: a first participation kata <u>and</u> a second one in case of a draw for one of the 3 first places. If a participant chooses to perform the same kata twice, he will be given a ½ point penalty by each judge.

RULES - ELITE KATA - MAY 31

- 1. The **Elite Kata** competition is open to participants aged **16 years old and up** and ranked from **1**st **kyu to Black Belt**.
- 2. A judging team consists of **5 judges**, including the **head judge** who takes charge of the competition.
- 3. For each division, a **preliminary round** establishes 6 finalists.
- 4. In the eventuality of a tie breaker* for the 6th place during the preliminary round, the head judge asks the ex-aequo participants to perform a kata again to establish the winner of the 6th place.
- 5. In the **final round**, the total of the scores of both rounds is used to determine the 3 winners among the 6 finalists.
- 6. A participant **cannot present the same kata form** in the preliminary and final rounds.
- 7. In the eventuality of a tie breaker* for the 1st, 2nd or 3rd place during the final round, the head judge asks the ex-aequo participants to perform a kata again to establish the winner of the given place.
- *: In a tie breaker, participants <u>can</u> present the same kata form or choose another one.

CONTACT KARATE FIGHTING

HOW TO WIN A FIGHT

- With one Ippon, two Wazaari, or the disqualification of the opponent (Shikakku) –
 End of fight and immediate win;
- By unanimous decision at the end of regulation time based on the allocation of a Wazaari;
- By a **favorable decision of most judges and referee** (at least 2/3 or 3/5) at the end of regulation time based on:
 - <u>Damage inflicted on the opponent</u>: The effects of one or many strikes that are not worth of a Wazaari but are close to it.
 - <u>Techniques and tactics</u>: The superiority of techniques and tactics displayed with the intention to dominate the opponent.
 - <u>Number of strikes</u>: Attack activity illustrated by many strikes delivered with both arms and legs in most of the actions initiated by the fighter. Just moving forward not delivering strikes is not considered as an attack activity.
 - Attitude and fighting spirit: The preference is given to the fighter who initiated more attacks.

NB: The allocation of a Genten Ichi or 3 Chui prevents a fighter from winning the fight; the fighter can at best get a verdict of equality.

Ippon and Wazaari - Winning Strikes

- **Ippon**: Immediate win following a legal technique having caused the interruption of the fight <u>for 3 seconds or more</u> End of the fight.
- **Wazaari**: Legal technique having incapacitated the opponent (guard down, lack of alertness, physical instability) <u>for less than 3 seconds</u> Resumption of the fight.
- **Second Wazaari**: Wazaari leading to an immediate win by Ippon End of the fight.
- An Ippon or a Wazaari must been seen and called by most judges and referee (at least 2/3 or 3/5).
- The fight is interrupted by the referee who makes the official announcement of the Ippon or Wazaari.

Chui and Genten - Official Warnings and Penalties

- All official warnings and penalties are allocated by most judges and referee (2/3 or 3/5).
- The fight is interrupted by the referee who announces the official warning or penalty
 - **Chui**: Official warning following an infraction
 - **Genten Ichi**: 1st penalty following 2 official warnings
 - **Genten Ni Shikakku**: 2nd penalty following 2 other official warnings Disqualification of the fighter Immediate win of the opponent.

FIGHTING WITH PROTECTION GEAR

A Contact Karate Fight with protection gear (Semi-knockdown) involves two opponents who may hit each other "with force" as far as they respect the rules in effect at the Dagéki 2020 - as described below.

1. ELIGIBILITY

- Male and female fighters aged 4 and up, from 10th kyu (white belt) to black belt, assigned to divisions based on age, gender, kyu and weight
- A fighter cannot be enrolled in both Fighting with protection and Elite Fighting
- 2. PROTECTION GEAR Provided by each fighter
 - Mandatory protection gear: shin pads with instep, gloves, helmet
 - Visor: highly recommended to all fighters
 - Mouthpiece: highly recommended for all fighters.
 - Mouthpiece or head gear with grid: <u>mandatory</u> for fighters with orthodontic braces
 - Groin cup: mandatory for male fighters.
 - Chest protector: <u>mandatory</u> to fighters aged 13 & under
 - Chest protector: <u>not allowed</u> for fighters aged 14 & up
 - Breast protector (inside uniform): mandatory for female fighters aged 14 & up
 - Wrist and ankle wraps: <u>not allowed</u> for all fighters
 - Spectacles and jewels: <u>not allowed</u> for all fighters

3. REFEREEING TEAM

- A refereeing team consists of one center referee who supervises the fight, 2 or 4 corner judges who evaluate the fighters, one timekeeper and one scorekeeper.
- The referee can consult with corner judges, the timekeeper and the scorekeeper before announcing his decision.

4. FIGHT REGULATION TIME

- 1 ½ minute for fighters aged 13 years old and under
- 2 minutes for fighters aged 14 years old and up
- 1 minute for the first and unique extension round in case of a tie

5. LEGAL TECHNIQUES

- To the legs (above the knees): circular kicks and knee kicks
- To the body: open hand, punches, elbow strikes, knee kicks and kicks (straight and circular techniques)
- To the head: circular kicks only 14 years old & up

6. ILLEGAL TECHNIQUES

- Kicks to the knee joints and under the knees
- Open hand strikes, punches, elbow strikes and head-butt to the face, head or neck
- All strikes using hand, fist, elbow, knee, foot to the groin or back
- Knee kicks and straight kicks to the face
- 13 years old & under: circular kicks to the head
- Grabbing and sweeping
- Repeated shoves of the opponent
- Refusal to fight

7. COACHES

- Only one coach can sit near the fighting area, on the side of his fighter.
- The coach is not allowed to access the fighting area at any time.
- Only the coach may bring grievances to an organizer of the Championship in case of conflict.

ELITE FIGHTING - KNOCKDOWN - NO PROTECTION GEAR

An Elite Contact Karate Fight (Knockdown – no protection gear) involves two experienced adult opponents who may hit each other "with force" as far as they respect the rules in effect at the Dagéki 2020 - as described below.

1. ELIGIBILITY

- Men and women karate fighters, 18 years old and up, 4th kyu to Black Belt, assigned to divisions according to gender, weight and age (for men).
- A fighter cannot be enrolled in both Elite Fighting and Fighting with protection
- A white uniform (dogi) is mandatory.

2. PROTECTION GEAR – Provided by each fighter

- Mouthpiece: <u>highly recommended</u> for all fighters
- Groin cup: <u>mandatory</u> for male fighters
- Breast protector ("bustier" worn inside the uniform): mandatory for female fighters

Prohibited gear:

- Head gear, gloves, shin pads, chest protector
- Wrist and ankle wraps (except in case of injury inflicted during a fight at the Championship)
- Spectacles and jewels

3. REFEREEING TEAM

- A refereeing team consists of 1 center referee who supervises the fight, 4 corner judges who evaluate the fighters, 2 timekeepers and 1 scorekeeper (fight sequence).
- The refereeing committee receives the coach's grievances and can intervene with the center referee.
- The center referee can consult with the corner judges, the timekeepers, the scorekeeper and the refereeing committee before announcing a decision.

4. FIGHT REGULATION TIME

Masters Divisions – Men 40 years old and up

- First round : 2 minutes
- In case of a tie: one 2-minute extension round Decision
- Qualifiers Women and Men 18 years old and up
 - First round : 2 minutes
 - In case of a first tie: a 2-minute extension round
 - In case of a second tie: fighters' weigh-in
 - If the weight discrepancy is greater than11lbs/5kg (men) or 9lbs/4kg (women), the lightest fighter wins;
 - Otherwise, one last 2-minute extension round Decision

Quarter finals, Semifinals and Finals Fights - Women and Men - 18 years old and up

- First round : 3 minutes
- In case of a first tie: a 2-minute extension round
- In case of a second tie: a second 2-minute extension round
- In case of a third tie: fighters' weigh-in
 - If the weight discrepancy is greater than11lbs/5kg (men) or 9lbs/4kg (women), the lightest fighter wins;
 - Otherwise, one last 1-minute extension round Decision

5. LEGAL TECHNIQUES

- To the legs (above the knees): circular kicks and knee kicks
- To the body: open hand strikes, punches, elbow strikes, knee kicks and kicks (straight and circular techniques)
- To the head: kicks and knee kicks (straight and circular techniques)

6. ILLEGAL TECHNIQUES

- Kicks to the knee joints and below the knees
- Open hand strikes, punches, elbow strikes and head-butt to the face, head or neck
- All strikes using hand, fist, elbow, knee, foot to the groin or back.
- Grabbing

- Repeated thrusts to the opponent
- Refusal to fight

7. COACHES

- One or two coaches can sit near the fighting area, on the side of their fighter.
- No coach has access to the fighting area at any time.
- Only one coach may bring grievances to the refereeing committee in case of conflict.

Any competitor (or coach) **whose country of residency** <u>is not</u> **Canada** is considered as an international competitor (or coach).

Online Registration of International Competitors

• Online Registration for Dagéki 2020 will be from February 1st to April 15, 2020.

Visitor Visa for Canada

- Every international competitor (or coach) must himself apply for a Visitor Visa when required by Canada. At the express request of a competitor (or coach), the Dagéki 2020 Organizing Committee will email him an Invitation Letter to the Dagéki 2020 to be presented to the Canada Embassy in the country of residence of the competitor (or coach).
- IMPORTANT: The Dagéki 2020 Organizing Committee does not vouch for any visa demand. The invitation letter only confirms that the Dagéki World Karate Championship will be held on May 30 and 31, 2020 in Ste-Anne-de-Bellevue, QC, Canada.

Health and Hospitalization Insurance Policy

- It is the responsibility of **every international competitor** to get an Insurance Policy that will cover health care and hospitalization costs that could be incurred following his participation in the Dagéki 2020. The Dagéki 2020 Organizing Committee will not, in any manner, be held responsible for injuries and hospital fees incurred by a competitor during the Championship.
- A proof of the competitor's Health and Hospitalization Insurance Policy must be transmitted to the Dagéki 2020 Organizing Committee no later than April 15, 2020 to ensure his participation in the Championship.
